Situated in the Southern Highlands the Iringa Region is home to the pristine, remote and still virtually untouched Ruaha National Park, which, with its contiguous game reserves & buffer zones forms a vast wildlife area, home to a large population of Elephant, Cape Buffalo, Lion, Leopard, Giraffe, Hippo and many other animals including some 400 and counting, bird species.

Rates

Lodge: Chalets (en-suite) \$100- pp sharing on FB basis. (Pack lunch if on safari or tour)

Ruaha National Park Game Drives: \$225 - per day per vehicle (max. 4 passengers per vehicle)(PEF not included)

Park entrance fees (PEF): currently \$20 pp per day. (Subject to change by the Govt. Visitors are liable for and required to pay for any increases)

Walking safari: \$10 pp + \$15 per group (max 6 per group) (Subject to change by the authorities)

Transfers from Iringa to Lodge & return: \$225 per vehicle per return journey (max. 4 passengers)

Transfers from Dar-es-Salaam to Lodge & from Ruaha Airstrips to Lodge: Arranged & quoted on request.
